Definition of a Large Scale Event:

- an event, managed by NIMS, including, but not limited to:
 - multiple alarm fire incident
 - evacuation
 - major HAZMAT / public safety incident (bomb)
 - search and rescue operation
 - major accident/road closures
 - major public disturbance
 - rail / air accident
 - “short fuse” non-emergency event

Structure of a Large Scale Event:

- Personnel
 - Geographically zoned areas – N, S, E, W
 - Specialized Task Force – setup a county wide “team”
 - Add the CAD listing of equipment at what companies

Training for a Large Scale Event:

Important: Training is both an initial and an ongoing/continuing effort.

- NIMS – class and practical with drills
 - insure that a “fire police command” position is in place and used in every NIMS controlled incident

Large Scale Event Suggested Operating Guidelines Task Force – Meeting #2

- Fire Police Certification Program
- Communications Training, both radios and procedures
- Preplanning exercises (exhibit of completed form)
- Company and Inter-company drills and table top sessions
 - fire police only, as well as combined drills with police/fire


Equipment for a Large Scale Event:

- For ALL Fire Police Officers
 - Hat
 - Safety Vest
 - Badge
 - Flashlight/Baton
- For a Traffic Unit and/or Properly Equipped Squad
 - cones, baracades, signs, flares
 - arrow board, other control devices
 - radios – 800MHz and/or company frequency
 - safety related gear (AED, gloves, vests, helmets)
- POV – what equipment on board?
 - radio? cell phone? (example of WWFP “Mug Sheet” and pocket-sized info card)
 - map book – company, county
